

## **Surprise! Nature's Flash Dancers - Fireflies**

Fireflies or Lightning Bugs are one of nature's most magical things to see. Despite their common name, fireflies are not flies or bugs, but beetles and there are over 2,000 species of these nightly wonders.

They can be found all around the world, but they prefer to fly in warm and damp forests were there is plenty of food.



Fireflies have a light organ in their lower abdomen.

From here they carefully release chemicals that react with oxygen in the air which produces the magical blaze of light. This is called 'bioluminescence". The light is cold and can be green, yellow or orange.

Fireflies use these flashing lights to attract their mates and also to ward off predators that might like to eat them.

The regularity and brightness of the flashing helps them to easily identify males and females.

### Plants and Wildlife in tropical Malaysia

Johor is a state rich in different types of plants including the Lobster claw Bird of Paradise, giant Guava, Banyan trees, Orchids and Bougainvillea. It is also rich in wildlife such as Leaf Monkeys and Long-tailed Macaques, Monitor lizards, Geckos, Eagle owls and Flying frogs.

Many of these appear in the jungle gardens of Night Lights. Others, however, simply live in Tok-Bah's magical stories.


